The meeting was called to order at 8:15 P.M. by President Phyllis Yeager in the undercroft. Ms. O'Leary led us in prayer.

Secretary's Report – Motion by Marilyn Goldstein and seconded by Tracy Osburg to approve the minutes from the last meeting as prepared by Julie Bertsch, Secretary, and then passed by vote.

The available funds balance was \$17,911.95. (Money is always kept aside to cover our known expenses.) Principal's Report – Ms. O'Leary reported on all of the activities during the Lenten season with a focus on prayer this year. Each week prayers are centered around different stations of the cross. Student Council began its almsgiving project this week called "Eggcellent Opportunity to Share" by giving each student a plastic egg which they were asked to fill with coins as their own contribution to support three causes selected by Student Council. Also, students, teachers and staff all have prayer partners during Lent. On March 31st they will have a bread service where they read the scriptures of the Last Supper. The opportunity to receive the sacrament of reconciliation has been made available to the students. Please check the server schedule for times your child may be scheduled to serve. Everybody Counts is this week. Thanks to Kathie Landrum and Donna Diederhofer for organizing the presenters and guest speakers, and thanks to all who have volunteered to help with the presentations. There will be a special liturgy this Fri. and all are welcome to attend. Last week, Grades 7 and 8 participated in the diocesan competition. Congratulations to Nikki Matteoli for her 3rd place in the drawing category of art! Good luck to Andrew Jensen, our geography bee winner, who scored high enough on the national written test to participate in another contest at Western, KY Univ. in April. We will have standardized testing for Grades 3, 5, 6, and 7 beginning Apr. 19th through Apr. 29th in the mornings. This year we will be using the Iowa Test of Basic Skills. There are two sets of tests, the achievement test and the cognitive test. Spring pictures will be sent home tomorrow. Please send in either the pictures or the money by next Wed., before Spring Break. Report cards will go home tomorrow in the home folders. April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month, a time to raise awareness about child abuse and neglect and encourage support of children and families. We have a tree decorated with blue ribbons in front of school as a symbol of our support. Thanks for participating in the Papa John Pizza night, which is the third Tues. of each month with the next one on Apr. 20th. Parent meeting for first reconciliation will be Monday, Nov. 23rd at 7 P.M. in the cafeteria for 2nd Grade parents. Service learning activities are beginning. 6th Graders have been studying measurement and are baking for Welcome House. The 2nd Grade is beginning a project on animal rescue. They have a speaker coming this week and hope to design Christmas cards with a pet theme.
